

CONNECTING SPIO SENSOR DATA TO GREENKEEPER APP

GreenKeeper App and Spiio have partnered to link the soil moisture, temperature and salinity data from the Spiio soil sensor network to GreenKeeper's agronomic models. Current functionality allows GreenKeeper users the ability to view the most recent reading from the various Spiio sensors at their facility. The functionality will quickly expand to include models including root diseases and root health metrics, herbicide and insecticide applications, and an easy display of past soils data.


Installation instructions:

1. Login to your Spiio account at app.spiio.com and navigate to your Organizations page. You can get there by clicking your name in the top-right corner of the screen, and then clicking on the "Organizations" word.

NOTE: Users need to have admin access at the organization to view this page.

2. Find the organization you'd like to link to GreenKeeper and locate the API key. Copy the text to past it into GreenKeeper.

NOTE: Small screen resolution on a phone screen or small browser may hide this API Key. It's best to use a computer to locate, copy and paste this API Key into GreenKeeper.
